



# Indoor Plant Guide

In our experience, we have found the following plants to work well on our indoor GreenWalls.

Here are a few tips, based on our experience creating greener spaces, to guide you on plant selection for your living wall planter.

- 1.) It is important when selecting plants, to ensure that you choose plants with similar watering and lighting needs.
- 2.) Select a combination of 4 inch or 6 inch plants to ensure a full, instant effect.
- 3.) Philodendron are very popular house plants because of its reputation for being easy to grow. There are roughly 480 types of Philodendron today with many exciting colors and patterns. While we have not tested all Philodendrons, we do know that many will work in the GrowUp system. We recommend talking to your local nursery about which Philodendrons and Pothos they carry and can recommend for your project.





## Indoor plant guide

### Syngonium White Butterfly

Light: Suited to medium to bright light.

Watering: Soil should be left to dry out between watering.



### Peperomia Caperata - Zorro - USA

Light: Suited very well for artificial, medium and bright light.

Watering: Soil to be left to dry out before watering.



### Aglaonema Pattaya Beauty

Light: Suited to medium light.

Watering: Soil to be moist.



### Leuconeura var. Erythroneura

Light: Suited to medium light.

Watering: Soil should be kept moist but well drained.



### Monstera - Split Leaf Philodendron

Light: Suited to medium to bright light.

Watering: Soil should be left to dry out between watering.



### Dracaena Compacta

Light: Suited to low to medium light.

Watering: Soil should be kept moderately dry.



### Golden Pothos - Money Plant

Light: Suited to medium light.

Watering: Soil should be left to dry out between watering.



### Asplenium Nidus - Birds Nest Fern

Light: Suited to medium to bright light without direct sunlight.

Watering: Soil should be moist but not wet with dry cycles.



### Philidendron Scandens + Mica

Light: Suited to low to medium light.

Watering: Soil should be kept moist during summer months but allowed to dry out between watering in the winter months.



### Hoya Carnosa

Light: Suited to medium to bright light.

Watering: Soil to be moist but not wet with dry cycles.







## Indoor plant guide

### Asparagus Plumosus

Light: Suited to bright but indirect sunlight.

Watering: Soil should be kept moist.



### Pothos Plant

Light: Suited to medium to bright light.

Watering: Soil should be left to dry out between watering in well draining potting soil.



### Chlorophytum Comosum - Spider Plant

Light: Suited to medium to bright light without direct sunlight.

Watering: Well drained potting soil mix.



### Aglaonema Maria - Chinese Evergreen Plant

Light: Suited to low to medium light without direct sunlight.

Watering: Soil to be moist but not wet with dry cycles.



### Plectranthus Baurii

Light: Suited to medium to bright light.

Watering: Soil should be left to dry between watering.



### Calathea Lancifolia Rattlesnake Plant

Light: Suited to medium to bright light without direct sunlight.

Watering: Soil to be moist but not wet with dry cycles.



### Philadendron Selloum

Light: Suited to medium to bright light.

Watering: Soil should be kept moist.



### Neathe Bella Palm

Light: Suited to low to medium light without direct sunlight.

Watering: Soil to be moist but not wet.



### Ficus Decora

Light: Suited to medium to bright light.

Watering: Soil should be kept moist but not wet.



### Calathea Burle Marx

Light: Suited to medium to high light without direct sunlight.

Watering: Soil to be moist but not wet with dry cycles.

### Maranta Leuconeura - Prayer Plant

Light: Suited to medium to bright light without direct sunlight.

Watering: Soil to be moist but not wet with dry cycles.



### Maranta - Lemon Lime

Light: Suited to medium to bright light without direct sunlight.

Watering: Soil to be moist but not wet with dry cycles.



### Nematanthus - Gold Fish

Suited to low to medium light without direct sunlight.

Watering: Soil to be moist but not wet with dry cycles.
